Know all men that I Cunningham Boyle of the State and district aforesaid farmer being by the mercy of God of sound mind and memory but knowing that "one event happeneth to all" do hereby constitute this my last will Viz.- Item. first I bequeath my soul <sup>to</sup> ~~in~~ my God the Lord firm in the faith of the Gospel of Christ and trusting for Salvation through Grace to the merits and atonement of my Redeemer alone- Item Second I bequeath to my beloved Mother in the event of her Surviving me Five hundred Dollars to be annually remitted to her out of my Estate the first remittance to be made her on the 1st. January next after my death and after annually each January during the term of her natural life- Item third I bequeath ~~to~~ my dearly beloved friend bosom companion and wife, ~~to Mary Boyle alias Mary Cannon~~ all the residue of my Estate both real and personal of what nature and kind soever it be which I now possess or which I may hereafter acquire to have and to hold the same during the term of her natural life.- Item fourth- I bequeath to my three Sons by the said Mary namely to John Boyle to William Boyle and to Edward Boyle in reversion after the death of their Mother the the said Mary all my Mill tract of Land situate on Crane Creek in Richland District containing by resurvey of Jesse Debruhl 1779 more or less together with that piece of my Jericho Lands on the North side of the Combess branch of Crane Creek adjoining the said Mill tract- supposed to contain 25 acres more or less together with all the Tools and machinery on Said Mill tract of land a road wagon and Team of 4 Mules or Horses Log Wagon and also the Team which usually hauls Logs to said saw Mill also all my Household and Kitchen furniture to have and to hold the same for ever after the death of their said Mother "Mary" Item fifth I bequeath to my dear little son Cunningham Boyle by the said Mary all my plantation on the North of Dry prory of little

crane Creek of 225 acres more or less consisting of three parcels lot from Hartins Michael Sharp and Bracey Nipper and wife and I also bequeath him my son said Son Cunningham any lands that I may hereafter purchase adjoining the said plantation on the North of little crane Creek together with all the stock, tools to appertaining thereunto belonging & Four Mules the wagon and wagon Gear to have and to hold the same forever after the death of his said Mother Mary.----

Item Sixth- I further bequeath to my dear little Son Cunningham aforesaid the sum of Five hundred Dollars to be paid him after the death of his said Mother Mary.---- Item Seventh- I bequeath unto my Four daughters by the said Mary namely to Anna Boyle to Mary Emily Boyle, to Jane Boyle and to Louisa Boyle The sum of Five hundred Dollars each to be paid each and every of them within a year after the decease of their Mother Mary.--- Item eighth -I will that my Executors Administrators and Assigns do sell the residue of my Jericho lands originally bought of Jas. S. Guignard containing one thousand and ninety two acres more or less provided they do not sell the same for less than one Dollar and twenty five cents per acre I bargain this said land away to Dr. Sam<sup>l</sup> Percival and I confirm the sale hereby if he complys with the terms within one year with Interest.----Item Ninth- In case any of my said Sons or Daughters Namely John William Cunningham and Edward- Anna, Mary Emily Jane and Louisa die under age or die intestate, I will that the property there may be left in this my last will be equally divided between them the survivors that is that the property will ed the deceased be divided amongst the survivors of them.- Item Tenth- I bequeath all my Negroes of which I may die possessed and all the residue of property not willed left by me or said Mary after the payment of our legal

debts be it of what nature and kind soever to be equally divided between my said four Sons of our daughters or the Survivors of them after the death of their Mother Mary.-- Item Eleventh-- I constitute and appoint the aforesaid Mary the Executrix of this my last will-- Signed and Sealed this 2d. day of September 1835
