It is my wish, that ~~as soon as my son~~ James Pollock (now residing with Mrs Summerville) should attain the age of thirteen, that my beloved Brother Peter Pollock should take him as an apprentice to his trade of Blacksmith or if my said son when he shall arrive at such age should dislike the trade or occupation of my said Brother it is my wish that my brother will act as his guardian and put him to whatever trade or occupation he (my son) may like best -

It is my wish that in case of the death of Mrs Summerville that my father should take charge of my son until he shall have arrived at the age of thirteen and in case of the death of my father it is my wish he reside with my brother the said Peter Pollock until the age of thirteen at which time I wish him to do as I have above stated -- --

I have a chest of tools now in the care of Mr. Andrew Blain, wheelwright Meeting Street near boundary Street Charleston S.C. which I wish my respected friend Mr James Young of Columbia S.C. to accept as a token of my regard -

I have a chest of clothes now in the care of Mr Wm McIntosh of Charleston which I give to Mr Andrew Blain -- --

I wish the house now in my possession to be sold and the proceeds together with the cash I have now in hand be ap-
