Thirdly I constitute and apoint my two Sons Agustus S Caldwell and James Caldwell as Executors to act on this my last will and testament in witness whereof I hereby Sign & Execute the same this Eighteenth day of february in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred & fifty three and in the Seventy Seventh year of the independance of the United States of america.
