

THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF DOROTHY SMILEY.-

I Dorothy smiley being of Sound mind and disposing memory do make declare and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other will which I may at any time heretofore have made.-
Item First I give bequeath and devise my house and lot in the town of Columbia and my negro woman Fanny to my great granddaughter Martha Ann Webb the daughter of Newell and Margaret Webb and her heirs forever.- OP rovided nevetheless and with this condition, that the said Newell Webb and Margaret Webb or the survivor of them shall have the right and privelege of living in the said house and upon the said lot, so long and whenever they see fit so to do free of rent or other duty.-

Item- Second I give and bequeath my Negro man Peter to the sole and seperate use of the said Margaret Webb to be kept by her and for her support until her youngest child attains the full age of twenty one years and that then the said Margaret take the said slave absolutely discharged from the said trust.-

Item- Third - I give and bequeath my horse and other cattle hogs and stock to Newell Webb and Margaret Webb absolutely.-

Item- Fourth The rest, residue and remainder of my estate, which may remain after the payment of my debts I give bequeath and devise to my executor, to be applied to the Schooling and Instruction of the children of the said Newell and Margaret Webb and William Sampson Wood the child of William Wood in equal proportions.-

Item Fifth- I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Edward J Anthur and John A. Moore the executors of this my last solemn will and testament . Witness my hand and seal this seventeenth day of December 1851
