A short Will in Legal form--

Considering the uncertainty of the mortal life and being
of sound and perfect memory blessed be the Almighty God for
the same, do make and publish this my last Will and test-
ament in the manner and form as follows, that is to say.

First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife one half of
my intire property both real and personal, the balance I
wish to be divided equally between my three beloved Sons,
John, Michael and Frasey, I hereby appoing Stephen Nullally
my Sole Executors of this my last Will and testament here-
by revolking all former by me made, if any, In witness where-
of I have hereunto Set my hand and affixed my Seal this 4th
day of October in the year of our Lord, one thousand Eight hun-
dred and twenty two.

for Richland District, To Benjamin F. Whitnor Esquire
Hamburg---I reposing especial trust and confidence in
the integrity care and circumspection of you the said
Benjamin F. Whitner have and by these presents do give
unto you the said Benjamin F. Whitner full power and au-
thority to administer the usual oath appointed to be taken
by Execution unto Stephen Mullally appointed Executor to
the last Will and Testament of Doctor John Walshe deceased-
and a due return of you doing herein you are to make and
give under your hand and Seal for my approbation or dis-
allowance--

Given under my hand and Seal this first day of July in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
twenty three and in the forty Seventh year of American In-
dependence--

I Stephen Mullally do Swear that I believe the paper now
produced to be a true Copy of the Last Will and Testament of
John Walshe deceased, the original Will being filed of re-
cord in the office of the Court of ordinary for Richland
County and State of Georgia and that I will produce to show
and inform the appraisers that shall be appointed by the
ordinary of Richland District, all and singular the goods
and chattels rights and credits of the Said deceased as al-
ready have or shall come into my hands possession or know-
ledge within the State of South Carolina and I will well
and truly administer on the same and will pay the debts
and Legacies as far as the said Goods will extend and the
Law require and that I will make and return a true and per-
fect Inventory of the said goods and chattels rights and
credits within the time prescribed by Law--
