The above Council Journal entry relating to Capt. Robert Brown and the Palatines, on 29 Jan 1744, is from Council Journal No. 14, p. 62, obtained by Beverly Shuler, OGS President, from the South Carolina Department of Archives and History, Columbia. The Journal commentary continues:

"A lame excuse for Capt: Brown's starving the Palatines.

Captain Brown being sent for, and interrogated whether he had used thofe Foreigners in the manner they had represented & Answered that if they had asked him for food in their language, he could not have understood them.

His Excell<sup>Cy</sup> ordered the Captain's Steward to be sent for, who attending accordingly and the Original Contract between Cap<sup>L</sup> Brown & thofe Palatines in Holland was also sent for and laid before the Board which being read and the particular species of Diet that was to be allowed for every day of the week being therein specified, His Excell<sup>Cy</sup> asked in particular if the said Germans had been fed last Friday in the manner contracted for, & the Steward replied that the Germans would sometimes reserve the taking diet on certain days, in order to have double Allow-

ance another, But his Excellency gave Capta to understand that as he was by virtue of h bound to maintain thofe Foreigners till the disposed of, if any should dye for want, wh his Ship he must answer for their lives, af they withdrew."

"The Petitioner therefore prayed that the annexed Acc! for the maintainance of those Foreigners be discharged.

"Ordered that the said petition and Accompt be referred to the Commifs! General, and that he report to this Board w! regards the truth of the said petition, and also enquire into the reasonablenefs of the Charge and report that also."

The next petition of a German immigrant shows the type of information that can be found in the Council Journals:

"Petition of Cornelius Miller; for land.

"Read the Petition of Cornelius Miller a German, humbly showing, That he came over here from Germany about 4 years ago with feveral of his Relations now settled in Orangebourgh Township upon the Encouragement of His Majesty's Bounty, that he was obliged to enter into Service to pay his pafsage, and was one Year with Mr. Dryton in Service and 3 Years an Apprentice with Mr. Williams a Carpenter at Ashley Ferry, and having now served his time, prays that 50 Acres of land be granted him in Orangebourgh Township and the usual Bounty.

"The Petit! appearing & swearing to the truth of the Allegations in his sd petition the prayer thereof was granted & ye Dept! Secret! y ordered to prepare a Warrant for ye land & the Commifs! to pay the Bounty accordingly." (Council Journal No. 14, pp. 63-64, 29 Jan 1744)

PLEASE LET US OFF THE BOAT! A petition made 5 days earlier:

"In the Council Chamber, Thursday A.M. the 24th day of January 1744...

"Petition of the Palatines on Board Capt Brown's Ship.

"Read the Petition of a considerable number of protestant Palatines, vizt most humbly shewing.

"That the poor petitioners have been on board the Saint Andrew Cap! Brown Commander thefe 26 Weeks past, and there is as yet no likelihood for them to get free of her, because there are none as yet who have purchased their Service, they therefore humbly pray his Excellency & Honours that they may find so much favour as to their pafsages, that a Sum equivalent to discharge the fame be raised by the Government, for which they promise to joyn in a Bond to repay the fame within the Term of three years with lawful Interest, and that if any of them shall not be able to pay the above Sum within that time, that the Government in that Case shall have full power to dispose of them and their Familys as they shall think proper, & pray ye Pre\_es (?) may be taken into Considerat! Signed Josan Melchior Meyer & about 19 more.

"Which Petition being considered it was ordered That the Comifsary General do enquire into the Number of able Men and women & Children ret the s.d. Petition, That he enquire into their as he can be informed, & report the fame to in order that further directions may be give therein." (Council Journal No. 14, p. 37,

"To the Hon: ble the President Senate of South Carolina in Afsembly Convened

"The Petition of the Freeholders & other Inhabitants on Edisto River Humbly Sheweth That it would be of Public Utility & general Advantage to your Petitioners to have a Road laid open & made Public from Orangeburgh to lead from thence the highest & best way to Slams (?) Bridge And that Two other Roads to & from the Same may also be laid out & made Public to Red Bank Ferry about three miles above the Edisto Saw Mills, By means whereof the Intercourse between ye Petitioners Settlements both with the Town of Orangeburgh & Charleston would be more Convenient & direct, and by having Commifsioners appointed to Superintend the Same may be always kept in good order & repair.

"Your Petitioners therefore Humbly Pray This Hon: ble House to take the Same into their Consideration and grant that the Public Roads aforesaid may be oppened & laid out And that there may be Commifsioners appointed to direct & Superintend the Same. And Your Petitioners as \_? duty bound will ever Pray, And so forth
