Several protestant Palatines who arrived hither & Palatines their Com. Capt. Brown's Ship, and whose services have not as yet, complaint ag^t Captain purchased, sent a Complaint by their Interpreter to the Com. for not allowing them provisions that the said Captain Brown had often withheld this from them on board his Ship and that they had been (days without meat or drink, particularly that last: they were the whole day without any the last sustenance (had been the like for several days before, and not only but all the rest of the Germans that still remain on board Brown's Ship.

The above Council Journal entry relating to Capt. Robert Brown and the Palatines, on 29 Jan 1744, is from Council Journal No. 14, p. 62, obtained by Beverly Shuler, OGS President, from the South Carolina Department of Archives and History, Columbia. The Journal commentary continues:

"A lame excuse for Capt: Brown's starving the Palatines.

Captain Brown being sent for, and interrogated whether he had used those Foreigners in the manner they had represented & Answered that if they had asked him for food in their language, he could not have understood them.

His Excell^{cy} ordered the Captain's Steward to be sent for, who attending accordingly and the Original Contract between Cap^t Brown & those Palatines in Holland was also sent for and laid before the Board which being read and the particular species of Diet that was to be allowed for every day of the week being therein specified, His Excell^{cy} asked in particular if the said Germans had been fed last Friday in the manner contracted for, & the Steward replied that the Germans would sometimes reserve the taking diet on certain days, in order to have double Allow-

ance another, But his Excellency gave Capt to understand that as he was by virtue of his bound to maintain those Foreigners till they were disposed of, if any should dye for want, w^{ch} his Ship he must answer for their lives, at which he withdrew."

"Petition of George Dellaback. About his petitioning a great number of the Palatines.

Read the humble Petition of George Dellaback shewing,

That on the 23^d day of Jan^y last the few Protestants whose names are annexed came from Cap^t Brown's Ship and landed in Charles Town having the language nor knowing where to go for Diet, remained on the public Streets half cold & hunger, in which Distress they were Hon^{ble} Benj: Whitaker & Hector Beringer de Esq^{rs}, who doubting if they were not soon they might be unanimously disgusted & returned a design to sail to Philadelphia, they therefore to the House of the Petition^{er} their Countrymen remained and had a plentiful Diet, for eight days, and of which your Excellency was after their coming to the Petitioner's House

JOURNAL (CONT.)

"The Petitioner therefore prayed that the annexed Acc^t for the maintainance of thofe Foreigners be discharged.

"Ordered that the said petition and Accompt be referred to the Commifs^y General, and that he report to this Board w^t regards the truth of the said petition, and also enquire into the reasonableness of the Charge and report that also."

The next petition of a German immigrant shows the type of information that can be found in the Council Journals:

"Petition of Cornelius Miller; for land.

"Read the Petition of Cornelius Miller a German, humbly showing, That he came over here from Germany about 4 years ago with feveral of his Relations now settled in Orangebourgh Township upon the Encouragement of His Majesty's Bounty, that he was obliged to enter into Service to pay his pafsage, and was one Year with M^rs Dryton in Service and 3 Years an Apprentice with M^r Williams a Carpenter at Ashley Ferry, and having now served his time, prays that 50 Acres of land be granted him in Orangebourgh Township and the usual Bounty.

"The Petit^r appearing & swearing to the truth of the Allegations in his s^d petition the prayer thereof was granted & y^e Dept^y Secret^y ordered to prepare a Warrant for y^e land & the Commifs^y Gen^l to pay the Bounty accordingly." (Council Journal No. 14, pp. 63-64, 29 Jan 1744)

PLEASE LET US OFF THE BOAT!
A petition made 5 days earlier:

"In the Council Chamber, Thursday A.M. the 24th day of January 1744...

"Petition of the Palatines on Board Cap^t Brown's Ship.

"Read the Petition of a considerable number of protestant Palatines, viz^t most humbly shewing.

"That the poor petitioners have been on board the Saint Andrew Cap^t Brown Commander thefe 26 Weeks past, and there is as yet no likelihood for them to get free of her, because there are none as yet who have purchased their Service, they therefore humbly pray his Excellency & Honours that they may find so much favour as to their pafsages, that a Sum equivalent to discharge the fame be raised by the Government, for which they promise to joyn in a Bond to repay the fame within the Term of three years with lawful Interest, and that if any of them shall not be able to pay the above Sum within that time, that the Government in that Case shall have full power to dispose of them and their Familys as they shall think proper, & pray y^e Pre^ses (?) may be taken into Consideratⁿ. Signed Josan Melchior Meyer & about 19 more.

1785 PETITION

OGS President Beverly Shuler obtained a copy of a 1785 petition of freeholders on the Edisto River:

"To the Hon.^{ble} the President Senate of South Carolina in Afsembly Convened

"The Petition of the Freeholders & other Inhabitants on Edisto River Humbly Sheweth That it would be of Public Utility & general Advantage to your Petitioners to have a Road laid open & made Public from Orangeburgh to lead from thence the highest & best way to Slams (?) Bridge And that Two other Roads to & from the Same may also be laid out & made Public to Red Bank Ferry about three miles above the Edisto Saw Mills, By means whereof the Intercourse between y^e Petitioners Settlements both with the Town of Orangeburgh & Charleston would be more Convenient & direct, and by having Commifsioners appointed to Superintend the Same may be always kept in good order & repair.

"Your Petitioners therefore Humbly Pray This Hon.^{ble} House to take the Same into their Consideration and grant that the Public Roads aforesaid may be opened & laid out And that there may be Commifsioners appointed to direct & Superintend the Same. And Your Petitioners as ? duty bound will ever Pray, And so forth

I think Samuel Hart must have taken his place (by is name, I developed that theory). Paul Turquand took over as minister for Prince Frederick's Parish 9 Sep 1766 to 25 Mar 1767. Dalcho said he followed Hiesendanner. What is the possibility that Turquand's original register would be in a repository in Washington, New York, or Berkeley, Calif.??--Inbeknownst?

I think, if not burned, such a register would have to go down in the McCord family that went to Mississippi. Then, maybe, it would have been sold after the Civil War to a place large enough to bury it or small enough not to know what a value it would have for us! It was known to be extant by Dalcho in 1820; so it survived the Rev. War. He spoke as if he had counted the entries and had access to it. I used to suspect Sam Stoney of having it. He has since died and no one has produced it, though.

So much for now. By the way I am beginning to find scattered South Carolina tax lists, etc., here in Charleston.

The following abstract of the will of William Snider of Orangeburg District, S.C., was submitted by Joe Hughes, 3643 Corners Way, Norcross, GA 30092. It was intended to appear in the last issue but was inadvertently overlooked:

"Wife Elizabeth use of all property for life or widowhood. Afterwards son Jacob SNIDER house and 334 acre plantation. Remainder of estate equally divided into six shares. One share each to son Jacob SNIDER; daughter Mary SNIDER; Grandchildren Albert and Susanna SHGEMAKER, children of deceased daughter Elizabeth; daughter Catharine BRICKLE and her daughter Martha RITTENBACER; daughter Rosena HOUCK or her children, and daughter Ann HARTSUCK or her children. Executor son Jacob SNIDER. Witnesses George SMITH, Henry TILL, and Caleb J. SMITH. Dated 29 March 1833. Signed William (his X mark) SNIDER. Orangeburg Co., S.C. THE TRUE ORANGEBURGH GERMAN SWISS

"DREAM COME TRUE"

Following is a copy of the contents of a letter written on Sept. 17, 1981, by Mr. E. B. Jelks, 223 Wilton Drive, Decatur, GA 30030, to his "new found cousin Camp Gillian from Kingsville, Texas." In reading the letter, you will see why your editor has titled this portion, "dream come true." At Oktoberfest, Mr. Jelks showed us some of the pictures he had taken in Switzerland--absolutely indescribable!

"Dear Cousin, Finally back in the good old U.S.A. and I'm very glad to be back. I would not take anything for the experience but I did not know how much I loved America.

"Cousin, I hit the jack-pot in Switzerland on the way over in May. I knew from a newspaper

clipping that a Mr. M. H. Felder of Orangeburg had gone to Switzerland many years ago to do I went to Orangeburg hoping to interview him but found that he was dead. The clipping mentions Entlebuch and Schieffleim Church in Entlebuch

We had only two days in Zurich before I had Geneva, Bombay, and then Colombo Sri Lanka. Over all the maps I could get in Zurich and no such names as those mentioned in the article. I found a valley named Entlebuch and on one map a village named Entlebuch. It also showed a village south of Entlebuch named Schupfeim. These are south of Lucerne and on a local railroad stand it to be that close and not at least 50

After checking the train schedules in Zurich I had only about 6 hours to spend in either Entlebuch or Schupfeim. Which do I go to? What a wild idea! Early the next morning Weldon and I caught a train from Zurich to Lucerne and then changed to the line to Entlebuch. I was not sure whether to get off at Entlebuch or Schupfeim. I still don't know why we went there unless the good Lord was guiding me.

We got off the train and immediately found it raining and we were in what has been a village for hundreds of years. Almost nobody speaks English; neither of us know a word of German. Through the kindness of I somehow got it over to the station master to go to the City Hall. He took his uniform and us to a new building accepting our thanks by saying "All signs in the building were in German, and after waiting around awhile I found my way into what I thought was the clerk of the court's office. Again, no English. Every time I mentioned Felder he would point to a door. I concluded he was trying to tell me someone had gone to heaven. How wrong I was. He was telling me that the Mayor of Schupfeim was named Felder and was upstairs on the second floor. But he was there for two days.

He let me look at old marriage and death records but did not go far enough for Hans Heinrich. A language (you have no idea how hard it is to learn), he sent me to another building. We knocked on the door and a typical Swiss woman who had been cooking dinner came to the door. Again, no English. But my hands were working better now and I found the old book depository.

I almost fainted when she brought out two listing marriages, deaths, births, and everything that happened in that section of Switzerland. The entries were Felders and I personally in the very early 1600's. But the writing

Just as I sat down to read the books, the pastor told me that a Catholic Father could speak some English. He had called him to come over. He came and I knew what I was hunting for and mentioned to Heinrich and his brother Peter were supposed to be there. Very casually he told me of course he knew. In fact, he had some of the stained glass windows in the attic of his church, and he took them to see them.

I got the impression the old church had been but not so. The windows he had were removed because they were deteriorating and had been replaced, at least to save the originals. The church was in poor condition, and he would arrange for transportation
