

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I Edward Fisher of the Town of Columbia being of sound and disposing memory ---- and understanding do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament manner and form following.-----
I give devise and bequeath unto my nephews Edward H Fisher and John Fisher my Farm containing about nineteen acres mere or less situate in the Rocky Branch adjoining the Town of Columbia together with the Mills and Tan yard establishment attached thereto together with the stock of Leather which may be on hand and Tools of every description appertaining thereto also nine negro slaves namely Joe, Mingo, Winter, Bella, Tom, Nancy and her three children together with their future increase also whatever may be due me by Jonathan S. Jinkins and Company.

Also my stock of medicine, Skeleton Shop Furniture and Library (exepting such Books as my wife may wish to retain) to them and their heirs and assigns forever. Subject nevertheless to the payment of my just and lawful debts. It being my express intention that the whole of the property contained in this Item shall be liable for the payment of my debts and Legacies.----- Ed.--- I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary the rest and residue of my Estate both real and personal to her and her assigns forever.-----

3d. I bequeath to Edward H. Fisher my Gun Fishing cane, violin and my watch and chain.-----

4th. Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my said wife Mary Executrix and my Friend Benjamin F. Taylor Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking any and all wills by me at any time heretofore made declaring this and no other to be my last will and Testament.---- In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and Seal this Twelfth day of March in the year of Lord one thousand Eight-Hundred and Thirty five.-----
