EDWARD HOLLIS

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN: I Edward Hollis of the State of So. Carolina and District of Camden Cooper being weak in Body but of Sound mind and perfect Memory, thanks be to God for the Same, but knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die, do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, First I Commend my soul unto my God and Saviour in whose meritts I trust for full Remission of all my sins, and my Body I commit to the Earth to be Decently Buried at the Discretions of my executors hereafter Named, and as for my Temporal Estate and such goods, and Chattles it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and Bequeath in the following Manner, and it is my will and Desire that all my just Debts and feneral expences shall be paid Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my Loving and Lawful wife Elenor Hollis and to her Heirs for ever the following Negroes Viz. Antrim, Tibb, Milly, and Nancy, Item I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid wife all my Stock of Cattle, Horses, Hogs, and Household furniture and to her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abram Hollis of the State of Pennsylvania the Sum of one Shelling sterling. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Wright the sum of one Shilling. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Garret the sum of One Shilling sterling. Item I give and bequeath unto my son if alive in the Kingdom of Ireland the sum of one Shilling sterling. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my Friend Capt. Richard Brown and my wife Elenor Hollis to be my lawful Executors and Execu'd of this last will and Testament, hereby revoking any other will or Wills heretofore make acknowledging this to be my only and last Will and Testament
