but of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty
of life and the Certainty of death do make and Constitute this
my last will and Testament, revoking all others heretofore by me
made as follows, -----

First- I commit my soul to Almighty God who gave it me and my
Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner. -----

Now concerning such property as it has pleased God to entrust me
with I dispose of in the following manner(to wit) . First it is
my will that my funeral expenses ~~be~~ be paid out of the first
money that may come into the hands of my Executors(hereafter
appointed) so soon after my death as possible. -----

Secondly- I give and bequeath unto my Three daughters Mary A.
Long Ann Drafts and Elizabeth Sligh to be divided equal between
them all the property that I am possessed of at the time of my
death of whatsoever Kind it may be, all my notes, money Beds &
Bedding , Furniture and every thing else that I may be in possess-
ion of, -----

Thirdly- My reason for not ~~being~~ giving my Grand Children the
Sons and ~~and~~ Daughters of my son William Stack dec'd any part of
the property that I may be possessed of at the time of my death
is that I gave to my son William Stack in his life time One Negro
boy named Tom and other things amounting to his distribution share.

Lastly- I do hereby nominate and appoint Jesse Drafts Executor
to this my last will and Testament . In witness whereof I the
Testatrix have hereunto set my hand and seal to this my last will
and Testament this Seventh day of September in the year of our
Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty three and in the Sixty
eighth year of American Independence. -----
