Benjamin Everett

In the Name of God Amen I Benjamin Everett being sick in body
But of Sound and perfect Memory, Thanks be to Almighty God,
and calling to memory the uncertainty of this Transitory Life
& that all flesh ~~may~~ yield to Death -- Do make and Declare
this my last will and Testament in manner Following -- First
of all I will and desire that all my just debts be duly paid
And secondly, the plantation I now live upon I do hereby Be-
queath to my Son James, the which I desire may be rented year
by year, & the ~~same~~ ~~given~~ into his hand the said James Everit
Likewise his four head of cattle, also one Feather Bed, and
Furniture, also four likely Sows, also one horse and Colt.--
Also I bequeath to my Daughter Margaret one Negro Boy Named
Sawney, one Mare & Colt, and two Cows and one Heifer-- Also
I give to my Daughter Isabella one Negro Girl Named Jenny al-
so one young Mare And Two Cows.-- Also to my Daughter Mary
I give one Negro girl Named Hager, one Mare & Two Colts, al-
so one Cow, my meaning is the Heirs of my Daughters Above
Named is to inherit the Above Bequests and if no lawful heirs
of their Bodies, then to revert to the Family or Estate-- Also
I give to my Daughter Margaret, one Bed & furniture-- Also to
Isabella one Bed & furniture.-- Also to Mary, I give one Bed
& furniture.-- The remainder of my Estate I desire may be
Sold at publick Vendue, and Equally Divide among the whole of
my Children Share & Share alike.-- And last of all I do here
by Constitute and appoint Wm. Everit, Richard Everit and Ben-
jamin Everit, my true & Lawful Executors, hereby revoking all
other wills and Bequests heretofore made, and Acknowledging
this to this to be my last will & Testament, In Witness Where-
of I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Ninth day of
Dec'r 1790-----
