

I George Turnipseed of Richland District So. Carolina Planter, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous of disposing of all the earthly goods, with which it has pleased God to bless me,-----

Do make and ordain this my last will ~~and~~ in manner following
Viz. First I desire that all my just debts and Funeral expenses be paid out of the proceeds of my present cotton crop.-----

2nd- I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Turnipseed all the plantation or Tract of land on which I now live during her life and after her Death to go to my two sons Viz. Adam Frederick, and Reddick Washington Turnipseed share and share alike.-----

3rd- I give and bequeath to my beloved Son James Turnipseed all that part of the Smith Tract that lies on the upper or N. W side of Patrick's branch, valued at six dollars per acre.-----

4th- I give and bequeath to my beloved Son George H. Turnipseed all that part of the Smith Tract that lies b'low or S. E. of Patrick's branch, and all that part of the John Turnipseed Tract that lies on the upper side or N. of Nathan Center's plantation Road, also valued at six dollars per acre.-----

5th- I give and bequeath to my beloved Son Thomas Turnipseed all that part of the John Turnipseed Tract that lies below or S of the said Nathan Center's plantation Road, and all of the Daniel Gradiok tract of land, valued at four dollars per acre.---

6th- I give and bequeath to my beloved daughters Barbara Ann Priscilla & Susan Ann, Adaline, six hundred dollars each in lieu of land, (except my daughter Priscilla prefers keeping a negro girl named Eliza instead of six hundred dollars.)

7th- I give and bequeath to my sons Levi T. Thomas, Adam F. and Reddick W each a horse at seventy dollars, or seventy dollars in money, and to my two daughters Barbara A. and Susan A. A. each a cow and calf at fifteen dollars or fifteen dollars in money,

and bedsted and big Wheel and also a saddle,-----

8th- I desire that all the rest of my Estate be sold, as soon
as convenient after my Decease, to the highest bidder, and after
my beloved Wife gets her thirds, that the residue be so divided
among all my children so that they may share and share alike,----

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Nancy Turnipseed and my beloved sons Henry and Levi T. Turnipseed
Executrix and Executors of this my last will and Testament In
testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 5th day of December 1839,-----
