to Daniel Hay Son of Dorch Hay my negro Girl Sarah and my
bay Stallion to him and his Heirs forever. Item I give and
bequeath to Hardy Hay's son William Howell Hay my negro wench
Betty and her child Betty also a tract of Land where I now live
fifteen Acres to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and
bequeath to Mary Hay Doughter of Dorch Hay my Winch Rose and
her Child Burrell to her and her heirs forever Item I give and
bequeath to my two Sons Dorch Hay and Hardy Hay all my Stock
of Cattle Horses Hogs Sheep etc. to equally divided between
them and their Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to Sarah
Bowers my Negro fellow Doweey to her and her heirs forever Item.
Item I give and bequeath to Uriah Goodwyn my three Negroes Cate,
Jude and Anica, to him and his heirs forever whome I make my sole
Executor of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12th day of April in
the year of our Lord one thousand seven Hundred and Eighty four
