

In the name of God, Amen. I Henry Cline of Richland District being now in good health, but calling to mind the uncertainty of Life, and deeming it necessary to make a Will by which my property and Estate shall be disposed of according to my desire, do make and ordain the following and none other to be my last Will and Testament.

1st. I recommend my Soul to God the giver, and I direct that my Body be decently buried.

2. <sup>ndly</sup> As I have no Children to inherit my Property, I dispose of that in the following manner, viz.-- I give bequeath and devise unto my esteemed long tried and trusty friend John Joell Chappell, to him and his Heirs for ever, the whole of my Estate and property both Real and personal, whether in possession or in action; and all my notes, Bonds, accounts, and demands and finally every thing which I have, or may die possessed of, or entitled unto. And I do hereby constitute and appoint him the said John Joel Chappell my sole Heir, and the sole Executor of this my Will

But <sup>rdly</sup> 3. If it should so happen that I should survive the said John Joel Chappell, and if by that means the aforesaid gift bequest and devise should become lapsed and inoperative so that the Heirs of the said John Joel Chappell cannot take and hold my said Estate and property under the foregoing clause in this will, then and in that case, I do hereby give bequeath and devise the whole of my property and Estate so as aforesaid enumerated unto the Heirs of him the said John Chappell absolutely and forever: intending by this Will that the said John Joel Chappell, if he be alive at my death, or, if he be then dead, then his Heirs shall have and enjoy the whole of my Estate and property in fee; and that it shall not in any event descend to or be inherited by my own Relations and kindred, or any of them. I do however hereby enjoin the said John Joel Chappell to

to take good care of my faithful Negro Woman Hagar, and to treat her well and I desire that she shall be set free free by my said Heir and Executor, if it be possible to do so legally, but if it shall be impossible to do so, then my desire is that she shall never be put to work as a slave but that she shall be supplied by my said Heir and Executor with a plentiful support of good and wholesome provisions and clothes, and that she be permitted to dispose of her time in such manner as she may think proper. And I further more direct my said Heir and Executor to pay to the said Hagar yearly and every year during her life the sum of Twenty Dollars, to be disposed of as she may think proper in providing extra articles of Clothing and Food for herself it being my desire that she shall never suffer for any of the necessaries of Life. And I do furthermore direct that the said Hagar shall have for her own use and benefit the whole of my Household and Kitchen furniture. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Eighth day of August in the year of our Lord 1825 and in the fiftieth year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States Of America.
