IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I John B. Brown late of the State of Virginia but now of the Town of Columbia being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding but calling to remembrance the uncertainty of human life and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows first I give and bequeath my Soul to almighty god who gave it I request my body to be decently buried with a christian burial and after requiring and trusting that all my just debts be settled I do dispose of all such wordly things as it has pleased God to endow me with as follows Viz. I give and bequeath to ~~John B. Brown and James B. Brown children of my brother Thos.~~ H. Brown a certain lot of land in the Town of Columbia containing one half of an acre and twenty Six perches fronting one hundred thirty nine feet one Inch and  $2/3$  on Richland Street bounded North by Richland Street-- East by Marion South by James Douglass lots and Westwardly by lots formerly belonging to Levy Wolf to them and their heirs forever.-Share and Share alike- I also give and bequeath to the said John W. Brown James B. Brown children of my brother as aforesaid the rest and residue of my property real ~~and~~ or personal of all description whatsoever.- and I leave my brother Thos. W. Brown as the common guardian of said children and executor to this my last will and testament- revoking all other.- In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hands and seal this Second day of Oct. 1830
