JOHN C. O'HANLON.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I John O'Hanlon of Columbia South Carolina being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, do make and ordain this my last will in manner following that is to say-----

1st-- I desire all my just debts be paid-----

2nd-- I give all my Estate both real and personal of what so ever kind it may be, to my daughter Margaret Daly O'Hanlon to her and the Heirs of her body forever-----

But in the event of her dying without leaving lawful issue then in that event I give my said Estate to her Mother's sister Mrs Martha E. Hunt wife of Alfred M. Hunt and her Heirs forever-----

3d-- It is my desire that my said daughter shall remain at school and receive a good and liberal education -----

4th-- I desire that my said daughter Margaret her aunt and Guardians shall consult together before my said daughter shall ever engage in any matrimonial connection- or take any other step of importance, that might involve her happiness-----

Lastly-- I constitute and appoint my brother James O'Hanlon - and my brother in Law Alfred M. Hunt and his wife Martha E. Hunt as Executors and Executrix, of this my last will and testament and also as Guardians, for my said daughter Margaret Daly O'Hanlon In testimony whereof I have unto set my hand and affix my seal this 5th day of October 1853/-----
