Know all men that I John H Holliss of the County of Morgan in the State of Alabama. Now in Columbia South Carolina being weak in body but of Sound mind do this day make Constitute and Establish this my Last will and Testament in manner and form following viz -

1st I desire that my Just debts be paid from my present crop on hand and other Effects Such as my Executors may Select

2'd I desire that my negroes be Equally divided between my Wife Harriet R. Hollis and my Son John L Hollis by persons chosen by my Executors for that purpose

3'd I desire that my Lands be divided by persons chosen for that purpose by my Exets and one third given to my Wife Harriet R Hollis & the Two Remaining thirds given to my Son John J Hollis

4th I desire that my negroes be kept together on my plantation during the widowhood of my wife or the minority of my Son in the Event of my wives marrying or my Sons becoming of age. I desire the division to take place as above stated

5th. I desire that the property both Real & personal. above givg to my wife H R Hollis Shall not be vested in my wife H R Hollis any longer than her natural life time but at her death Shall go to my Son John T Hollis.

6th. I do appoint my Friend Alin Frette & my wife H R Hollis my Executors to this my Last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand. this thirteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and Thirty Five and in fifty ninth year of the Sovereignty of the United States of America

of Each other Saw the testator sign the above will for the purposes therein contained
