Whereas I John Louis Raoul de Champ-manor, citizen of the united States of America resident at Bellaville Orangeburgh District, in the State aforesaid, being about to embark for France and in a Sound State of mind, do hereby in this fourth day of may in the rear of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four, make this and declare it to be my last Will and testament--

first: I give and bequeath to my Dear Beloved Wife Caroline every article of property that I possess real and personal for her Sole use and benefit during her life and at her death to be equally divided amongst our dear Children, Louis, Alfred, Caroline, Frederick and Harriet or the Survivors of them or their lawful issue

Secondly: It is my desire that should my Wife Caroline think necessary for her benefit and that of our children to Sell any part or the Whole of my property real and personal, I do by these presents authorise her to do so and that the proceeds of the Same in any funds or stock she may think advantageous after my Just debts being paid.

Thirdly: It is my further desire that when my daughters marry that any portion of their share of my property relinquished to them by their mother as Well as all the rest of their share of my estate, to which they may be entitled under my will be legally settled upon them and their heirs forever---- Fourthly: I do hereby appoint my Wife Caroline my executrix to this my last Will and testament made on this fourth day of may on the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four.
