IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. AMEN I John Lucious of Richland
district and State of South Carolina, do make and ordain this
my last will and testament First I give and bequeath to my be-
loved daughter Mary Ann Lucious a negro man slave named July
to her and her heirs and assign forever. Secondly I give all
the rest of my negro slaves to wit, Arther, Wall, Harry, Daniel
Kit, George, Jenny, George, calld Maryland George, Titus, Limus
Bridget, and all the increase of the said Bridget, and also all
the rest and residue of my estate of what name or nature it may
be to my two beloved children, the said Mary Ann, and my Son
John, in equal portions to them and their heirs and assigns
forever. I have a wench named Clarissa, whom I wish to set free
but as that cannot be legally done by will, I hereby give her
to my executors, hereinafter named, for the sole purpose of
enabling them to emancipate her by deed as the law requires,
and it is my earnest request that they do so immediatly after
my decease. My horse saddle and bridle I give, I except from
the above joint Legacies and give them to my said son I hereby
constitute and appoint my trusty friend James Adams, and my
beloved brother Philip Jacob Lucious and my brother in law
Benjamin Prescott executors of this my last will and testament
hereby revoking and declaring void all others. Witness my hand
and seal this twenty seventh day of May in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred and thirteen.

the testator as his last will and

his presence the presence of each other
have hereon to set our names as witnesses
to the same.
