Cows and Yearling, Item I give and Bequeath unto my
Fourth Son Thomas McKinstra One Horse Colt Two Cows and One
Yearling.-----

Item I also give and Bequeath Unto my well Beloved Wife
Jane McKinstra all my palntation where I now Live and
one half of the plantation Adjoining Griffin Harris To-
gether with all the Remainder of the Stock of Horses
Cattle Sheep and hogs. During Her Widowhood or life As
also the Household and Kitchen Fyrniture And at her death
or Marriage To be Equally Divided amongst my three Youngest Som
Sons Viz John James and Ythomas I do also will that my Two
Youngest Sons James Thomas Provided that thier Brother Jno
Remains in the same State of mind he is in at present. That
they take what Belongs to him in thier hands and take care
of him his lifetime, Also Do Constitute And Appoint my
Trustly Friend Joel Adams & William Weston sole Executors
of this my last will and Testament And I also Revoke and
Disannul all Former Wills by me in any wise made. And do
Acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament whereof.
I have hereunto Set my hand and seal this 14th day of Aug-
ust 1795.
