

JOHN B. TURNIPSEED

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I John B. Turnipseed, planter, being  
of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and  
calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous of  
disposing of all the earthly goods, with which it has pleased  
God to bless me do make and ordain this my last will in manner  
following. Viz, First I desire that the money arising from the  
sale of my present crop be applied and appropriated to the pay-  
ment of my just debts and funeral expences,-----

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary Sybile Turnipseed  
and my daughter polly Turnipseed the Plantation whereon I now  
live, composed of two different tracts one of one hundred and  
fifty Acres and one of twenty Six Acres, bought of John  
Turnipseed containing altogether one hundred and Seventy Six  
Acres more or less my wife to have the privilege of living on  
the said plantation during her natural life, and at her decease  
the whole plantation to belong to my daughter, Polly, and her  
heirs if she has any, if not to revert back to my heirs then  
living----- I also give and bequeath to my and my daughter  
Polly four cows and calves, and all my bedding-----

I give and bequeath to my Son John Turnipseed one hundred  
dollars ----- I give and bequeath to my two daughters, Elizabeth  
Lorick, the wife of George Lorick and Miley Frishly the wife of  
John Frishly and the heirs of their bodys, the plantation or  
tract of land, purchased by me from the heirs of Jacob Turnipseed  
lying on broad river, containing one hundred and thirty nine  
acres more or less, to be equally divided between them, I give  
and bequeath to my Step Son John Nipper Senr. the sum of five  
dollrs.----- I desire that all the rest of my Estate, be sold  
at public sale agreeable to the discretion of my executors and  
the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between my wife and  
all my children Viz, George, Patty, John, Elizabeth, Miley  
Nancy and Polly ----- And lastly I do constitute and
