RICHLAND DISTRICT) I Joel A. Tucker, of the State and District aforesaid, being low in health, but of sound mind and disposing memory; do make and declare this to be my last will and testament.----- First- I desire and direct that all my lawful debts be paid. Secondly. I do hereby give and bequeath the following special legacies,- To my friend William Weston I give my double barrel gun. To my uncle Joel Adams I give my gold watch. To my sister Christian G. Weston for her service to my self, brothers and sisters during our childhood, I give and bequeath (over and above, what I shall hereafter give her,) the sum of One thousand dollars. To my brother James R. Tucker(over and above, what I shall hereafter give him,) I loan my servant Billy during his Life, and after his death, should Billy be alive, I wish him to return to my sister, or their lawful heirs. To my servant Billy, I leave the sum of fifty dollars, to be kept in the hands of my executors, and given to said Billy by them, in the way they may think most advantageous. To my uncles James and Joel Adams, I give the sum of Five hundred dollars each for the good will and affection I have for them and their kind services rendered me from time to time. And to my distant and needy relative Isaac Tucker I give the sum of Seventy five dollars All the above legacies of money to be paid over, as soon as my executors find themselves able so to do, after my lawful debts are paid.-----Thirdly- The balance of my estate, I wish to be equally divided among my brother James R. Tucker, and sisters Christian G. Weston, Mary A. Tucker and Frances M. Hopkins, share and share alike. Giving my executors power to divide such things as can be done without injury, and selling such other things as cannot be divided.
