Second- I wish my estate to be divided into four equal parts I
give and bequeath one part thereof to my brother John and his heirs
forever-- one fourth part thereof to my brother James and his heirs
forever-- one fourth part thereof to my brother Robert and his
heirs forever.-- and the other fourth part thereof I give unto my
brothers John and James in trust and as trustees for the use and
benefit of my sister Caroline and the lawful heirs of her body
living at the time of her death. And I do hereby vest in my
brothers John and James full power to act with said bequest in any
manner that they may think proper for the benefit of said sister
and the lawful heirs of her body

And I do hereby appoint my brothers John and James executors to
this, my last will and testament. Given under my hand and seal
this twenty second day of November Eighteen hundred and fifty
