RICHLAND DISTRICT ) IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I John  
Marshall, of the State and District aforesaid, being of sound  
mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testa-  
ment in manner following to wit:-

Item 1st.- I will and bequeath to my nephew William Thomas Marshall  
son of Green S. Marshall fifteen hundred dollars- should the said  
William Thomas Marshall, be living at the time of my death, and  
should he be dead then the said Legacy to be given to his oldest  
son.-

Item-2d. It is my wish and desire that my Executors, hereafter to  
be named, do purchase from R. C. Woodard of Winnsboro, his mulatto  
woman, named Caroline, to effect which purchase , I wish the sum  
of one thousand dollars to be appropriated out of my Estate, if  
so much be necessary -- and the bond which I now hold on Howell  
Edmunds, to be appropriated for her support.-

Item-3- It is my will and desire that my said Executors do approp-  
riate the sum of five hundred dollars for the purpose of building  
a brick or stone wall around the old family grave yard, and also  
plain tombstone, and more than five hundred if necessary.-

Item-4- I give and bequeath to my favorite relation Cornelius  
Ann Hammond, daughter of John Z and Ann E. Hammond three hundred  
dollars.

Item-5th.- I give and bequeath to my other favorite relation  
Thomas E. Hammond Son of the said John Z, and Ann C. Hammond  
five hundred dollars.

Item-6th- I give and bequeath to my favorite relation Emma G.  
Reese, my servt. woman Eliza -

Item -7th- I give and bequeath to my other favorite relation  
Harry Edmund son of Robert H. and Ann V. Edmunds my servant  
woman Sarah, together with her two youngest children and the sum

of five hundred dollars.

Item- 8th- I give and bequeath to my other favorite relation Nicholas Edmunds son of Robert H. and Ann V. Edmunds the sum of five hundred dollars.-

Item 9th. I give and devise to Howell Edmunds my Baker tract of land, containing 300 acres more or less, not infringing upon the land that I leave to Caroline.-

Item 10th. I give and devise to Howell Edmunds my little servant girl Hannah Jane, daughter of Sarah.-

Item-11th. I give and bequeath to Frank Son of John D, and Emma Smith my old servant Bob.-

Item-12th. I give and devise to Samuel W. Leland, my servt. George-

Item-13th- I wish my Executors hereafter to be mentioned to sell as soon as possible all my negros; with the exception of those above devised to my different relations and friends.-

Item- 14th- I hereby authorize my Executors hereafter to be mentioned, after the various legacies have been paid, should there be any thing over and above, to vest it, for the benefit of Caroline, now servt. of R. C. Woodard of Winnsboro.

Item- 15th. It is my will and desire, that should any of my Heirs at law attempt to disturb this my last will and testament, that such Heirs at law be entirely excluded from any portion of my Estate.

Lastly - I ~~will~~ constitute, nominate and appoint my nephew Howell Edmunds, and my friend S. W. Leland Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former will or wills by me heretofore made, and declaring this to be my last will and testament.
