And wish my property to be disposed of in the following manner, In the first place I wish all my Just debts to be paid. Then I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth eight head of Cattle. Viz. Three Cows and Calves and two heiffers to be chosen by her out of my Stook, a dark brown horse Call'd Cole (only one eye). The house Gang of hogs Say three Sows twelve pigs and one barrow, also one feather bed and furn~~ture~~, and a Proportion of house hold and Kitchen furniture. and one third part of the Provision of every Kind, Then the balance of Cattle Horses and Hogs and all other Property of every Kind belonging to my Estate to be Sold to the Highest bidder on a Credit of twelve months, and when Collected to be equilly divided between my four children, namely Minerva Joseph William and Henry, and each one of them to have their Proportion as they come of age. After taking out the expences if any should be. I do also wish my Son Joseph to remain with my wife till he arrives to the age of twenty one, and to have as much Schooling as can Conveniently be given him in the time, I also wish my Son William to be put to a trade, it is to be recolected that my Son Henry is now at this date is only Six months old and if that or any of the rest Should die their property is to be divided amongst the Survivors--And I do hereby Nominate and appoint my friend Willey Jones and John McLaughlin as executors to execute and and Settle the affairs of my estate--
