Carey of the Town of Columbia being uncertain of life and very low in health, but of sound mine and disposing memory make this my last will and testament-----I wish my Dear Wife Rebecca to have one half of all my Estate real and personal, and when my Estate is appraised I wish my said Executors hereafter named, to let my wife take such of the negroes and other property at its appraised value, in part of her said half of my Estate, and if she does not get of the property enough to amount to one half of my Estate, then the balance to be paid in money and I give this much to my wife absolutely, forever to dispose of as she thinks best.---- And the balance of my said property I wish sold, after my Death, and the proceeds to be divided among my Brothers and Sisters Share and Share alike- the Children of my Deceased Brother and Sister to take their share of their parent. I appoint and Request my friends William Law and James Cathcart to act as my Executors.-----
