

LOYALISTS IN THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION FROM

THE DUTCH FORK OF SOUTH CAROLINA

The following lists of names were taken from Murtie June Clark's "Loyalists in the Southern Campaign of the Revolutionary War., Vol. 1", published by the Genealogical Publishing Company in 1981. From Clark's lists of Loyalist Company members I have taken the names of individuals who I believe lived at that time somewhere between the Broad and Saluda Rivers. Others who review these lists of Loyalist servicemen may come away with a slightly different set of names.

Readers interested in the events of the American Revolution are likely to peruse histories written before the advent of Clark's book. It is important not to lose sight of the fact that authors of histories of Dutch Fork families written before 1981 would not have had access to Clark's book and therefore would not have had a factual source of information to use in describing their Tory military activities.

To facilitate the identification of individuals in the lists I have added what I calculate to be the ages of the men and have provided names of their parents when they can be identified with reasonable certainty.

I hope these lists stimulate interest in reviewing and perhaps rethinking aspects of this important and sometimes confusing period of the history of the Dutch Fork and South Carolina.
