and memory do make and constitute this my last will and Testa-
ment revoking all Others.-

Item first; I give and bequeath to my friend Henry Lyons of the
Town of Columbia to him and his heirs forever my negre woman
Slave named Rose with all her future issue and increase; to the
intent that the said Slave may during the remainder of her life
have a kind Owner.- My Husband like my self is old and infirm
and I therefore prefer leaving Her to one who may be able dur-
ing the rest of her life to treat her with that kindness which
her fidelity and attachment to me for the last twenty years
richly merit at my hands.

In witness where of I Mary Lipman have to this my Will set my
hand and Seal this fourth day of November in the Year of Our
Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty one.
