Item 1. After payment of my ^{and lawful} just debts I give devise and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Crawford the wife of Matthew Crawford the whole of my Estate real and personal debts credits and effects whatsoever for and during the term of her natural life, and it is my express will and intention that all the property contained in this item shall be for the Sole, and separate use, benefit, and behoof of my said Daughter notwithstanding her coverture and shall not in any manner be under the controul of, or subject to, or liable for, the debts or contracts of her present or future husband -

Item 2. After the death of my said Daughter Nancy I then give devise and bequeath the whole of said property unto such Person or Persons as my said Daughter by will or other writing executed by her shall direct and appoint - and in case my said Daughter shall die without making such disposition I then give devise and bequeath the same to the child or children of my said Daughter as well those now in existence as those hereafter to be born to be equally divided among them and the Survivors or Survivors of them share and share alike

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint, James Martin Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby making void any other Will by me at any time heretofore made - Witness my hand and seal and seal this 30 day of December Anno Domini 1848
