In the name of God Amen I Mary Woodard of the State and district aforesaid being Sick and weak in body; But of sound and perfect mind and memory Calling to mind the mortality of my body; and Knowing that it is appointed for all flesh to die do for preventing controversies after my decease make publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) first and principally of all I recommend my Soul to the hands of Almighty god who gave it hoping for mercy through the merits of my blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus christ-my Body I desire to be buried in a decent christian like manner at the discretion of those my friends who may have the direction there of. Nothing doubting but that I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching and concerning my worldly Estate and affairs wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life First it is my will and desire that all my Just debts be paid--Secondly I give to my Beloved Son William Killingworth out of pure good will my negro woman Gracey and her girl child Miley and a boye child called Abram with all the futer Issue should any there be, Thirdly It is my wish that one hundred Dollars should be divided between my Daughter Pollys two children that is to say William Crocket and Mary Crocket, I also give them two feather Beds and there furniture the whole to be equally Divided between the above named William Crocket and Mary Crocket (Fourthly It is my express will and desire that every species of property owned by me ever and above what I have given to my Son William Killingworth and my two Grand children William Crocket and Mary Crocket Extra shall be divided between(in equal proportion) My eight Children Namely Jesse Killingsworth Sarah Hill, Noel Killingworth Mark Killingworth Jacob Killingworth and William Killingworth and Nancy Will-
