NANCY HODGE.

In the name of God amen I Nancy Hodge of Richland District South Carolina, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with do make and ordain this my last Will in manner following, that is to say: I desire first that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid after my decease, after which I give and bequeath to my loving and affectionate Daughter Zady Hodge the sum of One hundred Dollars--- I give and bequeath to my grand son Benjamin Hodge the sum of One hundred dollars I give and bequeath to my grand Son John Hodge the sum of one hundred Dollars--- I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Luscindy Hodge the sum of fifty Dollars . And if it shall turn out that there is a surplus left of my money or effects after the above specified sums are paid, then and in that case I give to the above named persons Viz. Zady Hodge, Benjamin Hodge, John Hodge and Luscindy Hodge the surplus that may remain in the same proportion as the above sums are proportioned to each named individual. And if there should not be a sufficiency left to meet the above stated sums, then and in that case, each of the above named persons must sustain a loss in proportion to his or her specified sum.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend and neighbour Michael J. Sharp Executor of this my last Will and Testament, by me made, In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of June Anno Domini 1837.
