All my Estate that is to say two negroes Hannah and Jack one
Grey horse and all money due me by Bond Note or open Account
Except my Bay Horse and ten guinies it is my desire to give
to Elizabeth Melmore. and lastly I do hereby make and or-
dain My beloved Brother Philip Partridge and John Partridge
my lawfull Executors of this my last will and testament in
witness where of the said William Partridge have here unto
set my hand and fixed my seal this nineteenth day of November
Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and
the twelfth year of American Independency
