

In the name of God amen I Philip Roberts recollecting that

I must shortly depart To realize an unknown world deem
it necessary to make such disposition of all the Estate it
that god hath in his kindness favourd me with at the same
time regarding myself as perfectly rational and Setting
aside all personal feelings.

I now proceed to direct in what way I desire all my prop-
erty both real and personal disposed of after my death-
My will is that all my Land be divided as here after direct-
ed that is to say my will is that my beloved wife if she
lives longer than I do remain on the plantation now occu-
pied by me enjoying all the benefits of all the tract em-
bracing that plantation and immediately after her death I
desire that my daughter Sarah Roberts have fifty acres of
the above mentioned tract of land.

And that my daughter Susan Ann Roberts have also fifty
acres of said tract of land and that the remainder of said
tract of land all belong to James A. Roberts and I desire
that all the tract of land owned by me known as the
Sugar Island tract and all the land belonging to me being
part of tract of land granted to Philip and William T.
Roberts dated 16th July 1841 belong to Thomas R. Roberts.
And my and my will and desire is that all my personal pro-
perty belong also to my wife during her natural life, and
immediately after her death that Thomas R. Roberts have
two cows and calves also that James A. Roberts have two
cows and calves, and that my daughter Sarah Roberts have
three cows and calves, and that my daughter Susan A.
Roberts have three cows and calves, and the balance of my
personal property if any be given to the child or children
that may be then living with their mother.

In reference to my household furniture my will and desire
is that my daughter Sarah Roberts have a feather bed and
furniture also Susan A. Roberts a feather bed and furni-
ture also a feather bed and furniture be given to Virginia

Evans daughter of Martha D. Evans-and the ballance of my
household furniture at my decease and the death of my
wife belong to my two daughters Sarah and Susan A. Roberts
My will and desire is that my Sons Thomas P. Roberts and
James Roberts for and in consideration of the Land I have
given them pay to Daniel Smith Twenty five dollars each,
that is after the death of their Father and mother-
Finally I constitute and appoint my Son David Roberts and
my Son William T. Roberts my executors to carry into ef-
fect this my last will and testament immediately after my
death. Signed and Sealed this twenty Sixth day of July in
the year of our lord one thousand Eight hundred and fifty
two, and in the Presence of
