testament . wills legacies. bequeath bequest and ex cutors by
me in any wise before named will'd and bequeathed. ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my last will and test-
ment in witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and seal
this 21st day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen
hundred and fifty one and in the 76th year of the independence
of the United States ~~of America~~.-----
