In the Name of God Amen--I Richard Smith of Richland District and State of South Carolina being weak in Body but of Sound mind memory and understanding--do make this my last Will and Testament in maner And form following. First I Will and desire that Sarah Feltsmetts Should have out of my Estate two Hundred Dollars to be paid to her by my Executors herein after named. Second I Will and desire that my Negro Fellow Isam Shall be Sold he having the choice of his own master with whom my Executors May agree on his valuation. the amount of which Sale together with that of my household and kitchen Furniture plantation Tools Horses Cattle Hogs and every thing Else to my belonging to be Sold at Public Sale on Such Terms as my Executors Shall think proper, the amount of which after paying off all my just Debts to be Laid out in the purchase of a Negro Woman that will Breed the Said Negro woman I give and bequeath unto Christain H. Feltsmetts John Margaret Martha Mary and Sarah Feltsmetts to them and their Heirs forever-- and I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends John Howel ^m W. Robert Howel and William Leadenham my Executors to this my Last will and Testament. Revoking all others heretofore made as witness my hand this I also Bequeath to Elizabeth Greatrick One Silver Watch and Two Hundred Dollars-- In witness whereof we hereunto set our hand and Seals this 20th July 1819
