thanks be to God for the same, do make and ordain this to be
my last will and Testament, in manner and form following

Imprimis after payment of my lawful debts I give devise and bequeath unto Martha Wilkesen my Chest of Drawers, one Bed-

stead, Pillows, Bolsten two pair of Sheets two Blankets one

Counterpane, Bolsten and Pillow cases one dozen Chairs and my

Silver half pint Cup, also the sum of three thousand Dollars to
her during the term of her natural life, and after her death
then the same ~~is~~ to descend to the lawful heirs of her body,

but should she die leaving no child or children then the Matters
contained in this Item together with the money shall revert to

my Estate and disposed of as hereinafter mentioned in the re-

siluary clause and I desire that the said sum of three thousand
Dollars may be placed at Interest by my Executors, or laid
out in property for her use during her life she having full

controul of the annual Interest or profits arising therefrom

Item 2d. I give and bequeath unto my friend James S. Guignard
the sum of five hundred Dollars in trust that he shall pay over
that amount to the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church

in Columbia to be used for repairs or additions to the Build-
ings on the ~~lot~~ or for any other purpose they may deem proper

Item 3 I give and bequeath unto my Executors hereinafter named

the sum of five hundred Dollars which is intended for the support
of foreign Missions and which my Executors are requested to
forward to the General Conference as soon as may be convenient
after my decease for the ~~fore~~said purpose

Item 4th. I give and bequeath unto my Executors hereinafter
mentioned the Sum of one thousand Dollars in trust nevertheless
for the sole and Seperate use benefit and behoof of my Cousin

ELIZABETH PARKER

Elizabeth Parker the wife of George Parker to be disposed of
for her benefit, in a y manner she may direct for her use dur-
ing life and after her death, for such use and purposes as she
may in writing direct, and in default of making any disposition
thereof then this Legacy to descend to the lawful heirs of her
body.

~~Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Cousin Elizabeth Parker~~
Guignard the Sum of two hundred Dollars to him and his heirs
forever.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath unto my Cousin the said Elizabeth
Parker my Gold Watch to her during life and after her death, to
my Brother should he be then living

Item 7 It is my will that my carpenter Joe shall be sold by my
executors as soon as ~~as~~ be convenient after my decease, he be-
ing first valued by impartial Persons, and that said carpenter
Joe shall select his own Master at the price or sum fixed by
the persons appraising him.

Item 8 I give devise and bequeath unto my Brother John Morton
bearing the whole of the rest and residue of my Estate both
real and personal, to him for and during the term of his
natural life and after his death to the lawful heirs of his
body.

Item. 9 Should my said Brother John Morton bearing die leaving
no Child or Children then and in such Case I will and devise
that upon the death of my said Brother the whole of the rest
and residue of my said Estate both real and personal and
contingencies appertaining shall be sold, and I do them give
devise and bequeath the proceeds of the Sales thereof unto my
friend James S. Guignard his heirs executors and Administrators
In trust nevertheless that he or they, shall ~~as~~ as soon as may
be practicable, forward the same to the South Carolina Confer-
ence a part of which I wish given to encrease the "Fund of

special relief" and the remainder to be disposed of by them
for the use and benefit of such other charitable institution
or institutions as may be by them deemed most expedient.

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Brother
John M. Waring and Friend James S. Guignard Executors of this
my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me
at any time heretofore made declaring this and no other to be
my last.

Witness my hand and Seal at Columbia this 24th day of June
in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty two
Signed Sealed published pronounced
and declared by the Testatrix to Selina Green
be her last will of Testament in presence of
us, who at her request in her presence and
in the presence of each other have Subscribed

thereof-
