SUSANNAH KIRK.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. I Susannah K Kirk being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body and thus calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous of disposing of such property as it has pleased God to give me, do make and ordain this my last will in manner following, that is to say.--

I desire first, that out of whatever property I may have at my DEcease a sufficient amount of funds may be raised as to pay my funeral Expenses Doctors Bill and any other just debts which I may owe.-----

I give to my Grand Daughter Sarah Stephens One Feather Bed.-----

I give to my daughter Rebecca Stephens to her & her children a note of hand, drawn by William Woods, of Chester Dist with Richard Woods Security for the sum of two hundred and Seventy five (\$275) dollars - also whatever other amounts of money may be due me by any person-- I also give to the said Rebecca a Trunk with the clothes & whatever Else it may contain which is at B Benj F. Kirks in Union District, also the trunk & clothes which I have with me & whatever Earthly goods I possess which are not by this my will otherwise appropriated.-----

And lastly I do constitute and appoint John Stephens Executor of this my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and annexed my seal this 1st day of November A.D. 1844.-----
