Egan of the Town of Columbia do make this my last Will and Testament in Manner following to wit I give and devise to Sarah Colvia to her and her heirs forever. all my property both real and personal after the payment of my Just debts and for the purpose of Discharging my Debts I Authorise her the said Sarah to sell and despose of any of my Property which she may think proper and at any time. She may think proper ratifying any such sale she may so make by this my Will and I do constitute and appoint her the said Sarah my sole Executrix of this my last will. In witness whereof I have hereto Set my hand and seal this 18th of August 1806

Guignard Esq. to take out letter with her Subject to her controul and use. this 30th April 1813
