In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Watts of Richland District State of South Carolina Being in full posession of My faculties But Calling to Mind the uncertinty of Life and the Certinty of death After----Commending my Sole to All-mighty God through the Merits of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and My Body to be Buried at the desorection of my hereafter named Executor. Item- I will that all my property Both Real Personal be Sold and the Monies arising from the Sales to be devided as followeth V. First I give and bequeathe to Joseph Watts-Six thousand Dollars; then after all my Just Debts and funeron Charges are paid the Balence of the moness to be Equally devided betwen my Brothers and Sisters. Item I do apoint and ordain my friend William Guphill my Lawfull Executors Given under my hand and Seal this the 19th October in the year of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ one thousand Eight hundred and nineteen and in the forty fourth year of the Sovereney and Independence of the united States of america.
