I, Timothy F. Quilter of the Town of Columbia Richland District South Carolina Being weak in Body but of Sound and perfect mind and memory, Blessed Be almighty God for the Same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Frances Quilter the Sum of \$175 dollars I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Johanna Quilter the Sum of \$175 Dollars

I give and Bequeath unto my Son William Quilter the Sum of \$50 doll's from the amount realized from the Sale of my personal property I desire that all my lawful debts be paid. Should the sum remaining together with the Collection of my out standing debts Exceed one Hundred dollars. I will and Bequeath said remainder if any to be Equally divided between my above Named daughters and the Said one Hundred dollars I desire and will Shall be Equally divided between my son John D. Quilter and my wife Sarah Quilter and should not the Sum realized from the above Sale amount to one Hundred dollars it is my wish that in such case it will and be Equally Divided between my son John D. Quilter, and my wife Sarah Quilter.

I also will and Bequeath to my wife Sarah one Mattress One Cot one pair Sheets 1 pair Blankets and one thin bed Spread. I give and Bequeath unto Catherine McGinnis one Silver watch marked Mountjoy Oak to be disposed of as she may think proper.

Which Said Several Legacies or sums of money I will and order Shall be paid to the Said respective legatees as soon after my decease as practicable, with the Exception of what may fall to my son John D. Quilter. And the time when he shall be Entitled to receive his portion or Legacy I leave to the Discretion of my Executors (Namely) Mr. Bor-

nard Reiley and William McGuinnis. I hereby revoke all former Wills by me made.

Declared by the above Named Timothy F. Quilter to be his last will and Testament in the presence of us who have herunto Subscribed our Names as Witnesses in the presence of the Testator and of Each other.

It is my will and Desire that the above Sum Bequeathed unto my Son William Quilter Be Expended in giving him an Education and for no other purpose
