I also Leave a certain tract of Land Soutsining Three hundred acres situate on Beaver Greek pranasbuch District to be sold and titles made by my Executors and the money to be Eaqualy Divided Between my Beloved wife and Children. I also Bequeath all my personal property to be Esqueally Divided Between my Beloved Wife Hannah Wassott and my Children Elizabeth Westoott Ebensar Westoott Early Westoott James Westoott and Samuel Wemcott.
