do make and Declare this to be my last will and Testament Here-
by revoking all others.- Item 1th- It is my will and Desire that
my hereafter mentioned Executors first to Pay my funeral Expences
and all my Lawful Debts.- Item 2 - I Bequeath and Demise unto
Charles Ellis so called Son of my Deceased Friend Mary Furman
the following Named slaves Viz. Tytus, Scipio, Frank, Lynda, Peter
Sawney Charlott, Kate, Sophia, Creasy, and Israell, Cumbo, Lucy
Dasy, Grace, and Tanah, with their future issue and Increase for
Ever. Together with all my stock of Horses, Mules cattle and
Hogs Plantation Tools, Debts of Every Discription that may be due
me at the time of my Death to be collected by him . Item 3 I
bequeath unto my Nephew William Spencer one Girl Named Patience,
During his natural Life and should he die without lawful issue,
Patience then to go to Martha Smith Daughter to Eleanor Smith,
with her Increase should she Have any for Ever.- Item 4th It is
my will and Desire should I neglect doing of it in my life time
that my Executors do without Delay Emancipate the Mulatto girl
named Dorothy or Dolly Daughter to Chaney and I do give to Her
for Her Support and maintenance . Two Slaves Dynah, and ailsey
and their Futer Increase for Ever, and so much money to be
collected by my Executors as Will Defray the Expences of
Emancipation Item 5 I do hereby Nominate and Constitute my
Friends John Oquin, John Taylor, and Andrew Wallace, my lawfull
Executors to this my last will in witness whereof I Have here
unto set my hand and seal this 13 Day of December 1817
