It is my desire that my executors hereafter named should pay out of my Estate all my lawful debts - I then give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Livingston one third part of all my estate - the other two thirds I give and bequeath to my dear children - John, William Moses David and Mary Livingston to be equally divided between them - and as John has negroe Jeffrey and William has the girl Rose and Moses the girl Mary, I wish them to retain them untill the debts are paid and the Estate is to be divided, when they shall be returned and divided as above specified - Further I do hereby nominate and appoint William Paulling S. Thomson and William I. Myddelton my Executors to this my last will and testament, hereby annulling all other wills by me made and declare this to be my last will and testament -
