this to be my last Will and testament.

First-- After my lawful debts are paid, I do hereby dis-
pose of my estate in the manner following, that is to say
I leave to the use of my wife, the whole of my estate dur-
ing her life.

Second-- After the death of my wife, I leave to my grand-
daughter Mary Tucker the sum of two hundred dollars, or, a
negro girl named Mary. I leave to Catharine D. M. Wood
a negro girl named Celia.

Thirdly-- The balance of my estate, I wish to be divided
into two equal parts--one part thereof to go to the child-
ren of my daughter Mary Wood- and the other part to go to
the children of my daughter Elizabeth Sloan.--

I do hereby nominate and appoint James Hopkins, Joel Adams S.
Joel R. Adams and James U. Adams, executors to this my
last will and testament given under my hand and seal this
26th day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty
six--
