I Abner Wingo of the State of South Carolina and District of Spartanburgh being frail and infirm in body, but of sound mind and understanding, considering the uncertainty of human life, do make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, viz;

First, I desire that all my Just and lawful debts be fairly and honestly paid, and that all debts due to me be truly and honestly collected---

Secondly, I give and bequest to my Son John, and my daughter Rebekah, one Shilling each, as they have already received the rest of their portions---

Thirdly, I give and bequest unto my two daughters Harriet and Polly each one feather Bed and one C w, and that they receive out of my estate a suitable and sufficient Schooling---

Fourthly, I give and bequest to my two Sons, Willis and Abner The land on which I live to be equally divided between them after my Wife's decease and not before, and also that they receive sufficient schooling out of my Estate---

Lastly, I give and bequest to my Wife Elizabeth all my proper goods and chattels of every description remaining of the above bequests--And also the right & possession of all my land during her life time, which is after and to be disposed of as above.

I hereby appoint James Nesbitt Executor and my Wife Elizabeth Executrix of this my last Will and Testament---

And in Testimony of what is above written I have here unto set my hand this 4th Day of February of. A. D. 1812 and of American Independence the thirty sixth---
