of Spartanburgh District South Carolina

1st I will and bequeeth unto my beloved wife
all my Land which is seventy three acres of Land
the same being more or less. also two negro men
Isaac and Harish three beds bedstead and furniture
and all the kitchen furniture four cows or more
all my hogs and the present crop of corn and
fodder my dear wife to have the above named
property during this life time or widowhood
after my death or marriage my will is that the
above property with the issue be equally divided
between my two children Gancy F. Darby and
Laurie C. Darby to come to them and their heirs

and I with my executors to sell the balance of my
estate except the present crop of cotton to be sold for cash soon
estate & at twelve months credit and after
collecting the money that is due to me and
the sale money my will is that they pay
all my just debts and the balance of the
money to be put out on interest to be equally
divided between my two children Gancy F. Darby
and Laurie C. Darby when they come to the
age of twenty one years. I do hereby ordain
and constitute my Brother David and my
friend John Fowler my executors of this my
last will and Testament in witness whereof
I set my hand and seal this 1st October 1836
