Bush, all that tract or parcels of land, situated in Spartanburg County, on line of S. S. A. Railroad near German Depot, and being same lot W. M. Amos & J. S. Amos built a Gin House, beginning on a stone in Garden Ring, thence N 38° W 3.14 to stake, thence S 35° E 103.18 to a stake, thence S 38° E 3.14 to stake, thence thence N 35° E 3.18 to beginning containing one acre more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, accoutrements, emendments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining: To Have and to Hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said S. A. Bush, his heirs and assigns. And we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said S. A. Bush, his heirs & assigns, against us and our heirs, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Whereas George W. Rogston
of Spartanburg County, in the State aforesaid is
desirous to partition and divide certain lands
among his children; and in order to make the
division among his children equal, he has caused
a survey and valuation of the said premises to
be made by Jos. Banchester Davis, George A. Davis
and William Moore; Now known all men by
these presents, that I, the said George W. Rogston,
as well for and in consideration of the natural love
and affection which I have and bear unto my
daughter Jennie E. Rogston, as also for and in
consideration of the sum of fourteen hundred
dollars, to be paid, and accounted for by the
said Jennie E. Rogston, in the final settlement
and distribution of my estate, have given, granted,
bargained, sold and released, and by these presents
do give, grant, bargain, sell and release unto the
said Jennie E. Rogston, during her natural
life, and after her death to her bodily heirs and
if she leaves none, then to the next of kin, all that tract
of land, as Sit No. 2, (and valued by the aforesaid
Commissioners, at fourteen hundred dollars)
lying and being in the County of Spartanburg
on both sides of Meadow creek, beginning at a
Spring, and running thence S 80. 10 46 chains
to a stake in the road, thence along the said
road to a stone in a branch, thence S 12. E 42.5
to a dead Red Oak, thence S 49. 10 2 chains to a
stake by a Herckory, thence N 84. E 69.55 chains
to a stone on the bank of the creek, thence up the
meanderings of the creek to a stake by a garden
