County in the State aforesaid, have granted,
bargained, sold, and released, and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and
release unto the said P. F. Williams all our
interest, right, title and claim in and to
a certain tract of land lying and being
in Spartanburg County State aforesaid on
Lawson's fork creek, beginning on a post (or
on the South side of said creek and running
