concern, I, J. H. Blanqugame, Sheriff of the

greeting: Whereas I, with others to James, et al. on or
about the 13th day of April, in the year one thousand
eight hundred eight hundred and eighty three
did exhibit their Complaint in the Court of
Common Pleas, in the County of Spartanburg
and State aforesaid, wherein I, with others to James
et al were Plaintiff, and Brazilla White, et al
were defendants for further reference see judgment
signed R. H. 7754, in Clerks office. And the
cause, being at issue before the Honorable the
Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the
13th day of April, one thousand eight hundred
and eighty three, when the said Court, after a
full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation
in the premises, did order adjudge and decree
that the tract of land herein after mentioned
