Whereas the corporation  
formerly known as the  
South Carolina Manufacturing  
Company in Spartanburg

County, was at the regular term of the Court of  
Common Pleas, of the County and State aforesaid,  
held on the day of April, 1880, duly adjudged to  
have been dissolved by operation of law on the 25  
day of December, 1878, all of which will appear more  
fully by reference to a certain action in said Court  
of Common Pleas, between Fort Waters et al. v. Miss  
against Gibson Bobo, et al defendants. And  
whereas among other things in said cause, it was  
ordered that D. R. Driscoll be appointed Receiver  
for said defunct corporation, with full authority  
to make titles to lands to back of the stockholders  
of the late corporation who had accepted said  
lands under the said partition, and also on who  
had purchased land, and had not paid for the  
same, all of which will more fully appear by  
reference to the order of said Court, and whereas  
A. G. Waters was the owner of the below described  
tract of land from S. Park former Agent of  
said Company now deceased, and who  
now bears the name of John G. Waters, that the  
said South Carolina Manufacturing Company  
in liquidation by D. R. Driscoll, Receiver  
appointed, in the State aforesaid, in consideration  
of the sum of Four Thousand and forty one  
and one half dollars, paid to S. Park  
and A. G. Waters, for the above described tract of

Land, which was originally sold to one J. S. Douglas, and the bond for title to same, executed by said Douglas to the said A. G. Waters, in the State aforesaid to have granted, bargained, reserved, sold and quit claimed, and by the presents do grants, bargains, sell, reserve and quit claim unto the said A. G. Waters, and to his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of land, lying and being and situated in the County and State aforesaid in the bond for title, executed to the said J. S. Douglas, as being on the tramway of the South Carolina Manufacturing Company, and running along the land of the Locomotive Company land on a straight line to the back line of the S. C. Manufacturing Company, on the branch thence along the branch on the back line and the tramway on the part west by running straight line from the branch to the tramway, it will make one thousand acres more or less, known as the tract sold by S. P. Dab, Agent to J. S. Douglas, together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, and all the right, title, interest, claim or demand whatsoever of the said South Carolina Manufacturing Company, either in law or equity, of, in, and to the above premises: To have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said A. G. Waters, his heirs and assigns forever.
